So we had six days in London, which was really good. We weren't organised for London. We didn't organise our time well there. We saw everything we wanted to see. We stayed at the Tower Bridge, down at the Tower Bridge area, which we thought was a great area.

Then we did the Shambles. So after that, we headed off, we caught the train, got on the train again and went to Edinburgh. We just can't believe how good the train system was to hear that.

So we headed up to Edinburgh and had three nights in Edinburgh, which was a nice amount of time. Still didn't see it all. I guess the highlight of Edinburgh was climbing up Arthur's Seat. You did it again. I was inspired by Doug. I didn't think I'd do it, but we did it well.

That place at Lowick was just like as I said, it was was like just picked that'll. Do we'll stay there? It's only a five minute drive to Holy Island Aussies because we weren't sure what the tides were going to be and if we were going to get over there, because everyone told us it was such a long drive. You're crazy. You'll never get there in time. But it was easy.
